



KEYNOTE ADDRESS Franz Liszt as the Cultural **Ambassador of the 19th Century**



Alan Walker is Professor Emeritus of Music at McMaster University, Canada. Before settling in North America he was on the staff of the Music Division of the British Broadcasting Corporation in London. He has broadcast for the BBC, for the CBC, and for CJRT - FM (Toronto), and gives regular public lectures on the music of the Romantic Era, a period in which he specializes. His thirteen published books include A Study in Musical Analysis, An Anatomy of Musical Criticism, and symposia on Chopin, Schumann, and Liszt. Time Magazine hailed Dr. Walker's three-volume, prize-winning biography of Franz Liszt, published by Alfred A. Knopf (New York), as "a textured portrait of Liszt and his times without rival." The Wall Street Journal called it "The definitive work to which all subsequent Liszt biographies will aspire." The Washington Post selected it as a Book of the Year. In January 2012, the Government of Hungary bestowed on Alan Walker one of its highest honours: the Knight's Cross of Merit of the Republic of Hungary.







Julie Ann Ballard has a DMA in Music Education from the University of Southern California and a MM in Piano Performance. Dr. Ballard is a published writer and composer, with works published by The FJH Music Co., Hal Leonard and NCKP. She presented her doctoral research at NCKP 2011.

Mindfulness in College Class Piano

John Ellis, Jani Parsons

The project sought to investigate whether the techniques of mindful learning explored by Harvard researcher, Prof. Ellen Langer, could be applied effectively in the college class piano setting with respect to the skill of sight reading. The project also explored the effect of digital piano technology on mindfulness in sight reading.

John Ellis is Associate Professor and Associate Dean for Administration, University of Michigan School of Music, Theatre & Dance. Professor Ellis is in demand internationally as a pianist, clinician, and lecturer.

Jani Parsons earned the DMA in Piano Pedagogy and Performance from University of Michigan School of Music, Theatre & Dance. Dr. Parsons is the pianist for the critically acclaimed Fifth House Ensemble in Chicago and is an award-winning Canadian pianist and teacher.

Self-Efficacy Research and Application to the Adult Piano Student

Sarah Evans Moore

This poster examines Bandura's theory of self-efficacy, described as one's belief in his ability to successfully complete the task at hand. Empirical studies in self-efficacy from several domains are reviewed, and several practical applications for piano teachers of adult students are offered.

Sarah Evans Moore recently graduated from the University of South Carolina with a doctor of musical arts degree in piano pedagogy. She is currently teaching private lessons and RMM group piano classes in South Carolina and Georgia.

The Pianist's Transition into the Teaching Role and Development as a Piano Teacher

Melissa Slawsky

This exploratory study provided a detailed perspective as to the induction experiences of the piano teacher. Twelve piano teachers of varying ages, educational levels, and years of experience were asked to reflect upon their transition into the teaching role, development as piano teachers, and to make suggestions for the future of piano pedagogy and the piano curriculum in general. Major themes included aspects of experiential learning, various forms of apprenticeship, and reflective practice.

Melissa Slawsky, Ph.D., NCTM is a dynamic teaching, learning, and information specialist with over 15 years of teaching experience in the private, classroom, and higher educational settings with a passion for teaching, consulting, and research.

Using Repertoire to Teach Technique: Chopin's 24 Preludes Op. 28

Sheila Barnhart

This research project explores the use of repertoire teach technique to piano students, focusing on Chopin's 24 Preludes Op. 28 as a set of pieces which encompasses a wide variety of technical skill requirements at several levels of difficulty. This project has three main objectives: Determine the technical skills each prelude requires; Create a grading scale and categorize each prelude; Compile practice techniques from scholars, Chopin's own writings, along with personal performance experience.

Sheila Barnhart is currently a DMA student at West Virginia University studying Piano Performance. She is currently Vice President of the WVU collegiate chapter of MTNA, and teaches in the WVU Community Music Program.

Creativity in Music Learning: A Sociocultural Perspective

Ashley Danyew

Creativity in music learning has been shown to develop intrinsic motivation and self-efficacy in children. Despite this, many teachers struggle to incorporate creative activities on a regular basis. This research poster examines the role of creativity in the music teaching and learning experience and the effect of motivation variables and social environments.

A music educator, pianist, and church musician, **Ashley Danyew** holds degrees from the University of Georgia and the Eastman School of Music. Currently, Ashley is pursuing a Ph.D. in Music Education at Eastman.

A Rediscovery of Ernst Widmer's Kosmos Latinoamericano: An Analysis of its Cross-Cultural Influences, Pedagogical Purpose, and Performance Approaches

Leobardo Guerrero

This research will present important aspects of Ernst Widmer's musical style and the influence of Béla Bartók's piano work *Mikrokosmos*. *Widmer's Kosmos Latinoamericano* was written as a progressive piano method with Latin American flair, containing folk songs, dances, and rhythms from Central and South American countries. I will present various selections spanning the four volumes of *Kosmos Latinoamericano*, focusing on the cross-cultural influences, performance practices, and suggestions for teaching and learning of each of the pieces.

Leobardo Guerrero, originally from Mexico City, is currently completing his Ph.D. in Fine Arts with an emphasis in Piano Pedagogy at Texas Tech University. He is an active teacher and performer.

Teaching Improvisation to a Classical Pianist: A Case Study

ina Liu

This study investigated whether basic improvisation skills could be taught effectively over an 8-week period to a college piano major with no previous experience in improvisation. The style of improvisation taught in this study was a monody and the main harmonic vocabulary used was diatonic chords in three major keys (F, G, D) and its relative minor keys. Both teaching sequences and changes in the pianist's improvisation skills will be discussed.

Jing Liu is a doctoral student at Texas Tech University, pursuing the Ph.D. in Fine Arts, Music Education. She received both Bachelor's and Master's degrees in music education from the Mainland of China.
