is one of the co-authors of A Symposium for Pianists and Teachers: Strategies to Develop Mind and Body for Optimal Performance.



## The Effects of Practical Experience on Students' Achievement and Attitudes Toward Keyboard Skills

Nan Baker, Jane Cassidy, and Evelyn Orman

This study examined how practical experience affects undergraduate group piano students' attitude and achievement in two areas: (1) accompanying; and (2) performing cadential chord progressions in major keys. Practical experience consisted of peer teaching and peer collaboration.

Nan Baker holds degrees from Louisiana State University and Florida State University and currently is pursuing a Ph.D. in music education at Louisiana State University. She teaches courses in piano pedagogy and group piano, and also maintains a private studio.

## Wrist and Finger Motion in Piano Performance: A Preliminary Investigation

Gustavo D. Cardinal

Using state-of-the-art motion analysis technology, this project collected quantitative data of wrist and finger angles during the performance of representative musical tasks at the piano. Upperlimb profiles were also collected in order to examine the relationship between movements and individual arm and hand characteristics.

Gustavo Cardinal is a doctoral candidate at Indiana University where he earned his MM and Performer Diploma. At IU, he is a faculty member of the Young Pianist Program, adjunct faculty at the IU Piano Academy, and former piano faculty of the Interlochen Arts Camp. He has performed solo recitals, concerti, and chamber music in the United States, Uruguay, Brazil, Argentina, Chile, Sweden, and Denmark.

### Effects of Early and Late Rest Intervals on Motor Skill Performance and Consolidation

Carla Davis Cash

The experiment was designed to study the extent to which fiveminute rest intervals placed early and late in practice influence learning of a keyboard sequence. Results suggest that extended rest intervals enhance performance and that the placement of rest in a practice session affects subsequent acquisition and consolidation of procedural memories.

Carla Davis Cash is on the faculty at Texas Tech University and holds degrees from The University of Texas at Austin and the University of Miami. She has presented her research in motor skill development and procedural memory consolidation at numerous conferences and is published in the *Journal of Research in Music Education*.

## Adaptation of Small-Handed Pianists to 7/8ths-sized Piano Keyboards

Peter Davis and Sarah Evans

This study tested the ability of pianists to adapt to playing a smaller-sized keyboard (7/8ths the size of a standard keyboard). Pianists who practiced one hour a day for five days found significant improvement in accuracy in a short amount of time. An attitudinal survey revealed that pianists adapted more quickly than expected.

**Peter Davis**, BA, MM, MA, Ph.D., is head of the piano department at Bob Jones University. Also active as a clinician, composer, and church musician, he has published numerous choral and keyboard works, including a graded hymn anthology, *Keyboard Treasury*. He has studied with Jerie Gail Ramsey, George Katz, Laurence Morton, and Jane Magrath.

**Sarah Evans** teaches group and private piano at Bob Jones University as a graduate assistant while completing her MM in piano pedagogy. She holds a BM in piano performance from Bob Jones University where she studies piano with Tom Grimble.

## Habits Common to Pianists with Dystonia and Involuntary Movement

Teresa Dybvig

Eleven students with dystonia or other involuntary movements were observed. They evinced strikingly similar incoordinate habitual movements and unproductive mindsets. The poster describes these attributes, and suggests healthy alternatives.

Teresa Dybvig is Director of The Balanced Pianist (www.Balanced Pianist.com). She teaches piano privately in Long Island, Manhattan, Chicago, and St. Paul. Holding degrees in piano performance from Yale University and Indiana University, she performs as a soloist and chamber musician throughout the US, in Europe, and in the Mideast. Dr. Dybvig was a member of the faculty of the Taubman Institute of Piano from 1995 to 2002, and the Golandsky Institute, through 2004. She has taught at Indiana University and Boston University.

### Current Research on Teaching Older Adults Sarah Tu

This project presents research on how life-long music learning can help the aging American society become healthier and how older adults can live longer and happier by making music a part of their lives. The research reveals the benefits of life-long music education for both teachers and students.

Chia-fang (Sarah) Tu is from Taiwan where she earned her first Bachelor's Degree in Theatre. She completed the BM at Weber State University (UT). She is currently a graduate student at Bowling Green State University, studying with Dr. Robert Satterlee (piano) and Dr. Cynthia Benson (Pedagogy).

## Practicing: Pedagogical Applications of Current Research

### Melody A. Hanberry

This paper examines various aspects of practicing as found in research journals and trade publications and addresses the following:

- 1. How can the teacher introduce practicing during the lesson?
- 2. How can the teacher assess the student's understanding of practicing techniques?
- 3. How do correct practicing habits and techniques relate to and/or prepare a successful performance?
- 4. How do students transfer this new knowledge of practicing techniques to the next piece?

**Melody A. Hanberry** is Assistant Professor of Music at Mississippi College where she directs the piano pedagogy and preparatory departments. Her degrees are from William Carey College and Louisiana State University. Dr. Hanberry has presented research at MTNA and NCKP and written for *Keyboard Companion*. She is an active adjudicator, collaborative pianist, and clinician.

## Improvisation in Group Piano Curricula Mark Laughlin

The purpose of the study was to investigate how academic institutions accredited by the National Association of Schools of Music meet the improvisation requirements set forth by NASM in their group piano curriculum. The research had three primary focuses: (1) the familiarity of the instructor with improvisation, (2) the text used in the group piano curriculum at each represented institution and (3) if/when/how improvisation was included within the curriculum.

Mark Laughlin is Assistant Professor of Piano and Piano Pedagogy at the University of South Carolina and director of the piano division of the Community Music Program. His research and teaching strategies on improvisation have been featured at the national conferences of the NASM and the College Music Society. He has also presented at the International Conference of CMS in Bangkok and Ayuthaya, Thailand as well as state conventions of the MENC. His articles have appeared in *Clavier* and the *Piano Pedagogy Forum*.

### A Study of Class Piano Proficiency Requirements in National Association of Schools of Music in Maryland, Virginia, Washington DC, and West Virginia

### Cynthia B. Ramsey

The purpose of this research was to investigate class piano proficiency requirements for NASM accredited schools in MD, VA, DC, and WV. The data collected concluded that improvisation is a functional skill lacking in both curriculum instruction and proficiency examinations. A recommendation for restructuring the curriculum was offered.

Cynthia Ramsey teaches class piano, music history and literature, and music education courses at Lynchburg College. She holds degrees from James Madison University and Shenandoah University. She served as an adjudicator at the World Piano Pedagogy Conference in Atlanta and presented research at the 50th MENC Eastern Division Biennial In-Service Conference.

### Technique and Ensemble Repertoire Project for the 3rd-Age Piano Student

#### Pamela D. Pike

This qualitative study identified specific characteristics of technical exercises and ensemble repertory that met the special needs of 3rd-age (approximately age 55 and older) piano students. Specific technique examples and ensemble arrangements identified as successful for this particular 3rd-age study group will be presented.

**Pamela D. Pike** is Associate Professor and Coordinator of the Group-Piano Program at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock. A graduate of the University of Western Ontario, Southern Illinois University and the University of Oklahoma, Dr. Pike is active as a clinician, adjudicator and speaker on pedagogical topics throughout the state of Arkansas. She has published numerous articles in *Keyboard Companion*, *American Music Teacher*, and recently presented a paper on learning theories at the International Society for Music Education Conference in Malaysia.

### The Attractiveness Bias and Its Effect on the Evaluation of Musical Performance: A Survey of Relevant Research in the Field

### Pamela Joy Sommer

This review presents the research literature on attractive bias and its effect on music performance evaluation. Numerous studies dealing with the attractiveness bias are exceptionally relevant to the field of music. Research in this area evaluates performers under a variety of conditions to determine what, if any, relationship exists between a musician's physical appearance and his or her subsequent evaluation in a competitive setting. Findings suggest that physical appearances may play a greater role in an evaluator's perception of talent, potential, and performance than is commonly suspected.

Pamela Sommer is currently pursuing her MM degree at the University of Colorado, Boulder. She is a student of David Korevaar, and coaches collaborative repertoire with Anne Epperson. Ms. Sommer holds a BM degree with honors from Indiana University and is actively involved as a soloist, collaborator, and piano teacher in the greater Boulder area.

## Piano Related Pain — Implication to Pedagogy Eri Yoshimura

Although pianists commonly report pain and musculoskeletal problems from playing, the related research literature on this topic is limited. My project reviews two recent studies on this topic and discusses how these studies can facilitate piano teaching.

Born in Osaka, Japan, **Eri Yoshimura** earned a music education degree from Shinshu University before moving to Denton, TX in 1998. There, she earned BM and MM degrees in piano performance from the University of North Texas. She is currently pursuing a DMA in piano performance with a related field in Music and Medicine. She has contributed to *Medical Problems of Performing Artists*.

### Familiarity with a Melody Prior to Training Increases Children's Piano Performance Accuracy

Katherine R. Goins

The purpose of this study was to examine the effect of familiarity with the sound of a melody on children's performance of the melody on a keyboard following brief training. Results indicated that prior familiarity with the test melody influenced children's ability to play the melody accurately following brief training, with older children performing more accurately than younger children.

Katherine Goins teaches at The New School for Music Study in Kingston, NJ. She holds degrees from Eastern Mennonite University, Ohio University, and the University of Texas at Austin. She teaches piano at the Virginia Governor's School for the Performing Arts and is co-chair of the Student Committee for the NCKP. Dr. Goins has presented her research on group teaching strategies and children's music and motor learning at the MTNA, MENC, and the Texas Music Educator's conferences.

### Mental Practice in Music Study: An Empirical Review of Literature

Lori Werner

Mental practice, the technique of silently rehearsing a skill in one's imagination, is a technique much studied and implemented in the area of sports. Mental practice techniques can also be used in the area of music to assist in learning and enhance performance. The purpose of this paper is to review the empirical literature related to the study of mental practice in the field of music.

Lori Werner is Assistant Professor and Program Director of Keyboard Pedagogy at the University of Miami. Her duties include teaching the graduate level keyboard pedagogy courses, undergraduate music technology courses, and directing the undergraduate class piano program. Dr. Werner has extensive experience teaching piano both privately and in groups, and implementing music technology into her teaching.

### Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder: Definitions, Strategies and Piano Study

Margaret M. Young

As educators, our goal is to provide each student with an opportunity to grow as a pupil and as a person. For students with a learning disability, that task is a unique challenge. Teachers who instruct special needs students have the responsibility to understand the medical findings in that area and be able to adapt traditional education practices to meet the needs of these students. The purpose of this review is to present relevant research literature to inform and equip musical instruction.

Margaret Young received her MM in piano performance and collaborative piano from Bowling Green State University where she studied with Laura Melton. Young received her BA in music performances with a specialized program in music management and an emphasis in communications from Luther College in Decorah, IA.

### Looking Inside the Box: Observation of Student Practice and Teacher Responses

NCKP Research Committee

Participating Members: Cynthia Benson, Huei Li Chin, L. Scott Donald, Joann Kirchner, and Lori Rhoden

The purpose of this study was to observe pre-college student practice with regard to time spent, type of practice, material (i.e., repertoire, technique), and number of correct and incorrect repetitions. Students responded to a questionnaire regarding their views and attitudes of their own practice and playing skills. Teachers of these students were asked to respond to a survey with open-ended questions regarding his/her approach to teaching practice skills and reactions to viewing recordings of his/her student practicing.


Cynthia Benson teaches group piano and piano pedagogy at Bowling Green State University and served as a foreign expert at Jimei University in Xiamen, P.R. of China. She is chair of the Research Committee of the NCKP and has presented research at international, national, and state conferences. Her articles have appeared in International Journal of Music Education, Update: Applications of Research in Music Education, Journal of Technology in Music Learning, American Music Teacher, Keyboard Companion, and Piano Pedagogy Forum.

Huei Li Chin is Assistant Professor of Music and Director of the Keyboard Development Program at Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville. Dr. Chin holds a Licentiate Teacher's Diploma from Trinity College of Music in London. At West Virginia University she earned the BM and MM degrees in Piano Performance, and holds the Ph.D. from Ohio State University.

L. Scott Donald is the Administrative Director of The New School for Music Study. He holds degrees from Furman University and The University of Texas at Austin. His research has been published in *Texas Music Education Research*, *Piano Pedagogy Forum*, and *Keyboard Companion*. Dr. Donald maintains an active performance schedule and is a frequent adjudicator of festivals and auditions.

Joann Marie Kirchner is the Coordinator of Secondary Piano at Temple University where she teaches both applied and class piano. Kirchner's degrees are from the University of the Arts, Temple University, and the University of Oklahoma. She has written articles for American Music Teacher, Keyboard Companion and Medical Problems of Performing Artists. She has presented at music educators' conferences in Maine, Maryland, Pennsylvania, and Minnesota.

Lori Rhoden is Associate Professor of Music Performance and Coordinator of Piano Pedagogy/Group Piano at Ball State University. Her performances and presentations have taken her to Hong Kong, Korea, and throughout the US. She has written articles for *American Music Teacher*, *Clavier* and *Keyboard Companion*. She is Immediate Past-President and collegiate chapters chair for the Indiana MTA. Rhoden holds degrees from the University of South Carolina, Southern Baptist Seminary, and Florida State University.


