Sample Teaching Sequence

- 1. Every class begins by singing the "Hello Song" with the animals.

 (There are new "Hello Songs" and new animals introduced in the each book.)
- 2. We always do a couple "Listen and Sing" songs (solfège), sometimes dancing with scarves.
- 3. In the earliest classes, there is an Activity Song.
- 4. I sing and play a Signal Song, "Go to Your Keyboards and sit on your chair, and we will play some music there."
- 5. Next we play a couple of pieces they know at their keyboards, or do patterns from a new piece.

I constantly watch to make sure they are still able to focus.

- 6. We get up and dance more, do some flash cards, or write on their white boards.
- 7. Then back to the keyboards to play again, always review pieces where I know they can stay with the accompaniment, and I work on hand position. When they are just beginning to get the notes, often the hand position suffers. That's why I never give a sticker after one week on a piece. I say, "We are building toward the Carnegie Hall performance of...*The D Song*." After it becomes familiar, *they* can focus more on hand position.
- 8. I always end with the most fun thing I can think of like, "Mr. Elephant's Funky Dance" or "Head and Shoulders Baby;" something high energy, before sending them home.
- 9. We end by singing the "Goodbye Song" and they receive stickers.
